The NUS Global Asia Institute (NUS-GAI) aims to take the lead in research and scholarship directed at topics pivotal to Asia's future. ABOUT NUS INITIATIVE TO IMPROVE HEALTH IN ASIA (NIHA)

NIHA, an integrative initiative set up to improve public health and healthcare delivery in Asia, was made possible with a funding of S\$17 million over 10 years from the GSK-EDB Trust Fund, which was established as part of the GSK-Singapore 10-year Strategic Roadmap. NIHA focuses on three key areas – research, high-level policy forums and leadership programmes – with the NIHA Forum being the first of many such initiatives. NIHA is coordinated by the NUS-GAI, in collaboration with the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, and the NUS Business School.

NIHA has two key objectives

- make a significant contribution to thinking and policy-formulation in public health and health systems development in Asia
- elevate Singapore to a leading position in healthcare policy and related research

NIHA will have a high quality portfolio that consists of cutting edge Research, high-level Forums and Leadership Programs. The cutting-edge Research and Forums in health policy will provide greater insights that can be used to develop the Leadership Programme. The Leadership Programme will train a talented pool of professionals in the field and enhance the capabilities and competencies of regulators and healthcare policymakers.



NIHA RESEARCH GRANTS

NIHA will facilitate highly multi-disciplinary collaborative policy research by experts in the healthcare field. It will integrate and leverage on the full range of expertise within and outside NUS, in particular the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, Business School, Duke-NUS Graduate Medical School and other Research Centres of Excellence and Faculties in NUS; and the Health Sciences Authority. It will also involve experts from within and outside the region as needed. NIHA's research activities will be driven by a 5-year rolling medium term research agenda (MTRA). Some of the topics to be covered include comparative Health Systems, Healthcare Financing, Health Economics, Integrated Healthcare Delivery and Prevention. The research will have a regional orientation and application.

NIHA POLICY FORUM

NIHA will organize regular high-level Forums on health policy. This Forum would be similar to the highly successful Singapore International Water Week and the World Cities Summit. NIHA proposes to organize an inaugural two-day Forum in November 2010. At this Forum, the first 5-year MTRA of NIHA will also be finalized.

The objectives of the Forum will be to promote discussions on key health challenges amongst key stakeholders and to identify common issues in health policy within an Asian context. The Forum will also aim to foster consensus building and partnerships among key policy makers in Asian governments and industry.

NIHA LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME

NIHA will deliver a flagship leadership programme on healthcare policy. The program will target emerging leaders from government, parliament, civil service, academia and civil society who contribute to health services delivery in the region and influence health policy. With a regional orientation, NIHA aims to have a highly relevant, wide-ranging and significant impact through its activities that will be multi-disciplinary in nature.
